

Firm's Chief Big Thirst Paid Part Found Guilty In Success Story Of Contempt

George Walther Jr., president of Dayton steel foundry, has been found guilty of contempt of court for disobeying an injunction in a civil suit against him and his son.

Common Pleas Judge J. Paul Brenton set 10 a.m. Friday for sentencing Walther.

The action stems from a damage suit filed against Walther and his son Jeffrey, 17, for the death of a girl in April, 1966. Susan Elizabeth Dunn, 16, of 5769 Anne lane, died in a one-car accident. Jeffrey Walther, who was driving a sports car, escaped serious injury but lost his right to drive for three years.

The suit was filed against Walthers in behalf of the girl's survivors.

After the suit was filed last fall, the judge ordered the damaged sports car held, to be produced for inspection by the plaintiffs at a later time.

When the car was scheduled for examination last month, attorneys discovered Walther had sold it.

Walther told the court he kept the car several months, but the building where it was kept was burglarized several times and parts were stolen from the car.

He said that when he heard nothing about a scheduled inspection, he believed it was all right to sell the car.

The car can't be traced, since Walther said he has no idea who eventually bought the car.

In finding Walther guilty of contempt, Brenton said "good faith" is no defense. The judge also said Walther violated the court's injunction by "making it forever impossible for any inspection or examination" to take place.

"Flying Peace Corps" Gets State Charter

United Missionary Air Training and Transport (UMATT), the Dayton-based "flying peace corps," has been granted a non-profit charter by Secretary of State Ted W. Brown.

The articles of incorporation established under an eight-member board of directors, which elected Hyde E. Rubie, vice president of the Srepro company of Dayton, as chairman.

Other members of the board are local businessmen Victor G. Reiling of the DuPont corporation; James J. Smiley Jr. of Graphic Services; Col. Stephen Bettinger of the USAF; Rev. James M. Darby, provincial superior of the Cincinnati Province of the Society of Mary; and Marianist brothers Robert Thomson and Michael Stimac.

Stimac, who spearheaded the organization of UMATT in early 1965, said becoming a corporation means "we have formally become an interfaith, non-denominational organization."

Until now, UMATT has been under the direction of Marianists at the University of Dayton. The organization files equip-

ment, doctors, nurses and mercy missions to some 150 isolated locations in east Africa. In the past two and a half years its fleet of aircraft has grown to five—all of which are based in Nairobi, Kenya. Stimac said UMATT is successfully demonstrating that aircraft — "which have not been

used as they might have for peaceful purposes—can be used to overcome the problem of isolation and resulting retardation

which has occurred for so long in Africa."
