Austrian Bishops
Ask Prayers
For World Peace

VIENNA—(NC)—The Austrian bishops in a joint pastoral letter have called on Catholics to pray for world peace.

The bishops asked for prayers that at least part of armaments expenditures be used for effective development aid.

The bishops recalled the Christmas message of Pope Paul VI which pointed to the dangers to peace. They listed the causes which the Pope had mentioned as especially dangerous to peace: nationalism, racism, militarism and class spirit which thinks only of its own social group to the exclusion of others.

The result is that the human society today, despite its technical and economical development, presents the sad and bitter countenance of division, hate and threats to peace, the Austrian bishops concluded.

LEOPOLDVILLE — (NC) — Premier Moise Tshombe told a meeting here of alumni of Christian Brothers' schools that it is thanks to civil servants trained by such teachers as the Brothers that the Congo is returning to peace and economic stability.

Tshombe, a Methodist, also told the alumni group he is grateful to the Holy See for Catholic missionary work in the Congo. He added:

"Several missionaries have died for their ideals and many others are still suffering. In spite of all, they are continuing to bring the Gospel to our people, to educate our children, and to care for our sick."

Midwest to Note
Tercentenary
Of Christianity

ASHLAND, Wis. — (NC) — Civic and religious ceremonies here June 13 will mark the 300th anniversary of Christianity in Wisconsin and the Midwest.

The celebration commemorates the arrival of Father Claude Allouez, S.J., on Lake Superior in 1665 and his founding of the mission of the Holy Spirit, the first church west of Lake Huron and north of New Mexico.

Father Allouez, a French Jesuit, came to this region in 1665 from Canada and established his mission at a site between the present cities of Ashland and Washburn. He remained for four years until relieved by the famous missionary and explorer Father Jacques Marquette, S.J.

FLYING GRANDFATHER

Max Conrad Delivers
Plane for Mission

ROME—(NC)—Max Conrad, noted "flying grandfather," and his Marianist Brother copilot have left here on the last leg of a 9,000-mile flight from the U.S. to deliver a new plane to the African missions.

The single-engine Cessna 206 belongs to the newly organized United Missionary Air Training and Transport (U.M.A.T.T.).

During their short stay in Rome, Pope Paul VI granted an audience to Conrad and Brother Michael Stimac, S.M., and blessed the new organization on behalf of the Kenya and east African missions.

U.M.A.T.T. will send planes to needy missions on request, particularly those in large, sparsely populated areas.

Its services, including a year's maintenance, have the

backing of 250 industrial concerns, including a large segment of the U.S. aircraft industry, Brother Stimac said. The two left Rome June 6 after Conrad made a solo flight across the Atlantic. Conrad will fly the aircraft over mission routes in Kenya and other parts of east Africa to initiate U.M.A.T.T. services.

SEOUL, Korea — (NC) — All Christian churches and Buddhist temples have been asked by local authorities to ring their bells at 10 p.m. to remind Korea's youth it is time to go home.

The bells are called "bells of love", to show teenagers that adults do care about them and their activities.
