Dayton, Ohio (C) — Craig Hafner, 28, a pilot who recently served two years in Tanzania as a Peace Corps Volunteer, plans to return to Africa next year as a member of UMATT, United Missionary Air Transport and Training. His bride of three months, Jill, will accompany him.

The Hafners are not Catholics, but are currently enrolled in Front Line, the Society of Mary's lay missionary training program at the University of Dayton. UMATT, initiated and

sponsored by the Cincinnati Province of Marianists, serves Protestant as well as Catholic mission outposts throughout East Africa.

Hafner said he was so impressed by Africa during his Peace Corps tour that he wished to return. While in Africa, he met Brother Michael Stimac,

S.M., UMATT's top field representative at Nairobi, Kenya, a key figure in establishing the flying missionary network. Subsequently Hafner decided to join the program.

The couple enrolled in the Front Line training course, founded and directed at the University of Dayton by Father Philip C. Hoelle, S.M.

Catholic Radio Shows Beamed To Russia

London (C)—The British Broadcasting Corporation broadcasts three Catholic programs a week to the Soviet Union, it was revealed here.

A Russian-born Yugoslav exile, Byzantine-rite Father Vladimir Rodzianko, is responsible for the broadcasts as head of the B.B.C. Russian departments religious section. One broadcast goes out each Saturday and two each Sunday. It is estimated each is heard by several million people.

The special B. B. C. service beamed to the Soviet Union for four hours a day deals generally with life in the Western world and Western reaction to life in the communist world.

Father Rodzianko's output ranges from Catholic services to talks on such subjects as Father Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, the late French Jesuit scholar.

Th broadcasts are not jammed these days, and Father Rodzianko gets a steady flow of fan mail. He is married like many other priests of the Eastern rite, and has two children.
