

# Brother Is Pilot, Teacher In Africa

Brother Paul Koller, Society of Mary, is back at his missionary work as a high school

teacher and pilot in Africa after a three-month refresher aviation course at University of Dayton. He's starting his second three-year hitch there.

Brother Koller, a 1949 graduate of Chaminade high school, was graduated from UD with a B.S. degree and earned his Master's degree at Ohio State university where he learned to fly.

Before leaving for Africa a few days ago he said he was anxious to get back, because "there's so much to be done over there."

Brother Koller teaches science at Mangu high school 40 miles from Nairobi, Kenya, and acquaints students with aviation.

In addition, he assists the United Missionary Air Training and Transport (UMATT), which transports doctors and nurses and makes other mercy missions throughout East Africa.

Operation and administration of UMATT is under the care of Marianists in Dayton. Service is provided on a no-charge basis.

"I'm not a fulltime UMATT pilot," Brother Koller explained. "I'm sort of doing double duty as a pilot and instructing in science and aviation at the high school."

He and fellow members of the Society of Mary comprise half the staff at Mangu high school. Natives make up the rest.

The Society of Mary contracts with Kenya to provide teachers.

Salary is unimportant to the missionaries, Brother Koller said.

"Actually I don't know what we are paid. We live in a common and salary goes into a common fund which supports us," he added.

He said boys at the high school learn fast, but are hampered by lack of background. "They have no technological background at all," he said. "That makes it difficult for them, especially when they come into direct contact with an airplane for the first time."

Only top students qualify for high school. Brother Koller estimated only 10 per cent of all elementary students attend high school.

"And there are many who never even attend elementary school," he added.

## Theatre Guild Here Opens Production By Priestley

English author J. B. Priestley, familiar of advanced science and high politics, opted for the art of Plato rather than Aristotle. "They Came to a City," grows out of a rich root system of didactic dialogue from "The Republic" to Bunyan's "Pilgrim's Progress" and Butler's "Erewhon."

The play caused a minor sensation in England in the late '40s, but its intellectual idealism hardly rippled the surface of the U. S. popular theater.

The Dayton Theatre Guild has mounted a credible production of Priestley's incredible proposition. The show, which runs through this week, exemplifies a salutary interest of the guild: bringing to light important but overlooked plays.

Priestley's rather courtly chiding of upper and middle class

foibles has gotten sympathetic treatment in the gentle and careful directing style of Jean Barger.

His "City" represents the ideal classless society, and he brings to it a cross-section of Englishmen: an overbred Lady and her overprotected daughter, a self-made businessman and a retiring country gentleman, an eager bank clerk and his cautious wife, a cockney cleaning woman, a wandering revolutionary lately a sailor, and a barmaid who quit her job.

They meet on a lonely hill, brought together in a mysterious condition something like sleep or death or dream, and a new door in a ruined wall leads them down to the "city of friends," where men have learned to live in love and co-operation, solve their problems, and enjoy one another freely.

Most of Priestley's characters

are only too glad to get directions back home. Only the old cleaning woman and the young girl choose to stay. The bank clerk wants to stay, but his close-minded wife browbeats him into leaving. The sailor and the barmaid will take the vision of this city back to the world of hard knocks and tell everyone their dream really exists and man can change for the better.

The guild cast is a reasonably believable one for an amateur production, and two of the character performances are beautifully right and moving. Katherine B. Saunders as the cleaning woman and James L. McGraw as the businessman make the most of Priestley's knack for charming stereotypes. The one outstanding weakness of the play is Priestley's flowery romanticism in his conception of his sailor and barmaid.
