## Montgomery Grand Jury Names 15 in Indictments

The Montgomery county grand jury reported indictments against 15 persons Tuesday, ranging from a \$7 robbery to second degree murder.

One of the most serious indictments was returned against Larry Minniefield, 18, of 1042 Springfield St. He is accused of breaking into a dwelling on S. Philadelphia St. during the night of July 17 and raping the woman resident.

**INDICTED FOR** second degree murder was Eugene Rutledge, 21, of 287 Dunbar St. Dayton police say he shot Thomas Leon Coleman, of 20 Upper Ave., on May 30 after an argument over a girl friend at 1525 W. Second St.

They say two shots were fired, one striking Coleman's leg and the other his chest. Rutledge said Coleman had pursued them from the girl friend's home into Rutledge's aunt's home on W. Second St.

Jessie Thomas Preston, 21, of 3909 Palmerton Ave., was indicted for a \$7 robbery. The money was taken from a man who had been beaten up after attempting to get \$10 back from a prostitute, police say.

**THREE COUNTS** of second degree manslaughter were returned against Ross Victor Doughty, 25, of 2328 Culver Ave. Officers said he was driving his car north on Riverside Dr. without due regard for safety, left of center, and with excessive speed (70 m.p.h. in a 40 m.p.h. zone). Killed in the acci-

dent was Connie Sue Kingery, of 830 Gruner Ave.

Lewis Edward Armitton, 30, of 2365 Lakeview Ave., was indicted for shooting to wound Police said he shot his estranged wife when he reached in her bra for a revolver she had placed there. The one shot penetrated her right breast, abdomen and right leg, police reported.

John David Weldon, 38, of 2505 Home Ave., was indicted for first degree manslaughter in the slaying death of Edwin Tins, 3207 Tucson Dr., at the Huffies Bar B Que.

**ESTELLE DWAYNE** Buck, 18, of 1600 DeWitt Dr., was indicted for escaping from Good Samaritan hospital on July 13. Officers say he was being treated there for a gunshot wound inflicted by police when he attempted to escape from them. He was being arrested on a shooting to wound charge.

Edgar Junor Oglesby, 19, of 419 S. Williams St., was indicted for shooting to wound Theodore Lewis, of 547 S. Broadway St. Police said the shooting occurred in front of Ben's restaurant, 1312 Germantown St., on July 5. Lewis was shot once in the chest.

### Holiday Prediction: 660 Traffic Victims

CHICAGO — (UPI) — When Americans take to the highways after 6 p.m. local time Friday for the Labor day weekend, from 560 to 660 of them will not return home, the National Safety Council estimates.

The death toll will be from 90 to 190 greater than that of a non-holiday period of the same length at this time of the year.

The council also estimated that at least 9.7 billion vehicle-miles will be driven, 300,000 more than normal travel during a comparable period.
