Douglas, 76, had joined his court colleagues Monday to hear 90 minutes of argument on capital punishment but returned to Walter Reed Army Medical Center overnight.

He suffered a stroke New Year's Eve.

A spokesman for the institute said Douglas would be there "at least two weeks."
