Chatley, a native of New York, worked in aircraft sales and advertising for three Wichita companies in the 1940s through the 1960s. He died Feb. 11, in Oklahoma City, after he apparently was trapped in freezing water following an automobile accinear his

Near the end of his tenure, the Wichita Area Chamber of Commerce put him in touch with Bill Lear of Gates Learjet in hopes he could help convince the company to locate in Wichita. Chatley was so successful that Lear hired him as a marketing manager.

He later worked for Rockwell International in St. Louis and Oklahoma City before taking an early retirement in 1979.

Acclaimed Writer Marsh Dies at 82

CHRISTCHURCH, New Zealand (AP) - Dame Ngaio Marsh, rated as one of the world's greatest mystery writers, died at her home in New Zealand Thursday at 82.

Marsh gained fame internationally with 31 successful mysteries and an autobiography, and won acclaim in her native New Zealand as a theatrical producer.

She was born April 23, 1899, and studied art at Canterbury University here before going on the stage as an actress for two years.

She began her career as a novelist in 1934, with the publication of "A Man Lay Dead," which introduced the hero of the meticulously researched mysteries to follow - the scholarly and gentlemanly detective Roderick Al-

Her 31st novel, "Photo Finish," was published last year.

She was created a dame of the Order of the British Empire in 1966. Marsh developed a heart condition

Doctor Pulled Plug On Man's Deafness

SYDNEY, Australia (UPI) - A 65year-old man's failing hearing was restored recently when a surgeon removed a cotton wool plug which had been in his ear for 60 years.

In a letter to the February issue of the Australian Medical Association Gazette, S.R. Misrachi told the story of a friend who for years had difficulty hearing.

The unidentified patient decided to get a hearing aid and visited an ear, nose and throat specialist who probed his ear with long, fine scissors.

"After some judicious snips, the surgeon removed a 2 centimeter (three-quarters of an inch) elongated pigmented cast bristling with little tufts of hair - and suddenly his hearing improved magically," he wrote.

"In fact, on leaving the surgery he was so startled by the roar of his car that with reflex he switched it off, fearing a major fault. He then realized that it was only his improved hearing."

Misrachi said the tale began in Hungary when the man was 5 years old and his mother took him to a doctor to be treated for an ear infec-

The doctor placed a cotton wool plug in his right ear and told his mother to bring him back in a week, but the boy recovered so well that she didn't return.




